

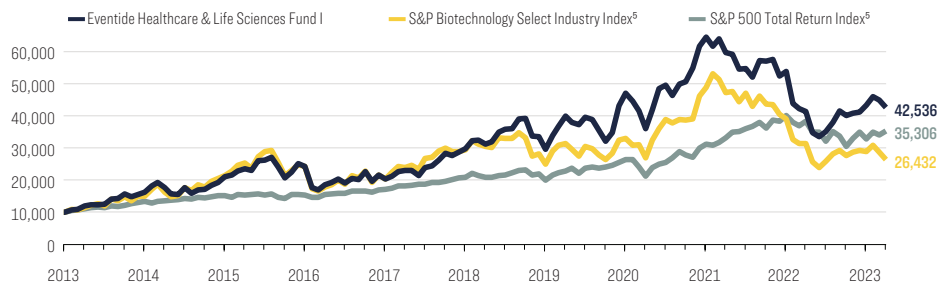
Healthcare & Life Sciences Fund Fact Sheet

The Eventide Healthcare & Life Sciences Fund seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation by investing in securities of healthcare and life sciences companies. The Fund invests in companies that we believe demonstrate values and business practices that are ethical, sustainable, and provide an attractive investment opportunity. The Fund also invests in securities with significant near-term appreciation potential. Under normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 80 percent of its net assets in equity and equity-related securities of companies in the healthcare and life sciences sectors.

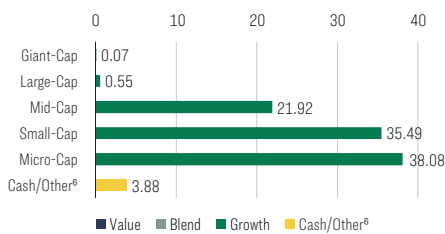

Portfolio Composition⁵ (%)

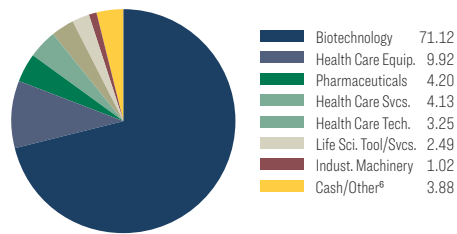

Eventide applies Morningstar's U.S. style zone to evaluate securities. Value is defined as having a current earnings yield greater than 10%. Growth is defined as having a current earnings yield less than 5%. Blend is defined as a current earnings yield between 5% and 10%.

Beta is a measure of the volatility of a fund relative to the Index. A beta greater than 1 is more volatile than the Index. R-Squared is a measure of how a fund's performance correlates with the Index's performance and it can help assess how likely it is that beta is statistically significant. Standard Deviation of return measures the amount of variation in historical performance from period to period.
